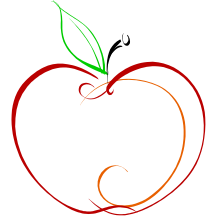

### **Questionnaire 2010**

Thank you, thank you, thank you to each one of the 47 members that took time at the March Guild meeting to thoughtfully respond to the Questionnaire.

Appleseed Quilters Guild Board and many committee members work very hard to ensure that you enjoy excellent programs, all special classes and events come off without a hitch, matters of importance are communicated to everyone, and that every last detail is covered. This means Guild members are able to sit back, relax, and take advantage of each Guild meeting to its fullest. From the President directing the Guild, to an officer sharing information about an upcoming event, to a member signing up students for a workshop – each member is important and plays a vital role in making the most of each Guild meeting... All of these individuals working together make your Appleseed Quilters Guild a very special organization. Let's make the next 16 years of Appleseed quilting as good as the first.

The AQG Board met in March and reviewed your answers to the survey. Members would like to know more about the board discussions, so you can look forward to Board Mini-Minutes starting in the April newsletter. Similar in form to the Mini-Meeting Minutes already posted in the newsletter, you will get an idea of the items handled each month at the Board meeting. If you have questions or would like more information, please do not hesitate to ask a Board member for more details. All Guild members are welcome to attend the board meetings, as stated in your membership handbook. The board meets the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm at the location noted in the newsletter.

And now, for a brief overview of the questionnaire:

1. ***Our Meeting Place*** – You like meeting at Classic Cafe. Last year we had to scramble to find a new location for meetings and classes when the Red Cross became unavailable. Terry and his staff have been very welcoming and accommodating to AQG. The rental fee each month of \$100 is a bargain compared to other facilities of this high caliber. Several years ago, a brilliant idea in the form of the Monthly Mini was born and that idea has rewarded us with the beautiful monthly mini quilt that helps to support our rent!

Classic Cafe is a longer drive for some of you, and obviously for others it is located more conveniently from work or home. You like the microphone, size, and lighting of the room, and you like using it for the daytime "Sit & Sew" on meeting day.

Some of our members have difficulty walking very far, so we need to ask more able members for their consideration by parking away from the door and walking in. Guests attend events in the other portion of the building, so we do share the parking lot with them on Tuesday evening. Also, look around the corner of the building (east side), and you'll see another parking area for our use.

Some of you like to do some handwork during the meeting so we will try to have several tables available for you depending on our program space needs that evening. Please bear with us as we try to get the right mix of tables and chairs.

No one asked for help with transportation to our meetings so let us know if it is needed.

2. ***Programs and Classes*** – The program committee has done a great job in pleasing members with guest speakers, table toppers, and socializing. We plan on trying to offer some weekend classes and speakers especially for those of you who work during the week. Thank you for your specific suggestions on topics such as: contemporary quilts, machine quilting, scrappy patterns, techniques, landscape quilts, and paper piecing.

Teacher suggestions included Carrie Nelson of Miss Rosie, Lauren Searing, Ami Sims, Bonnie Hunter, Denyse Schmidt, Gwen Marsten and Freddy Moran. Your wonderful suggestions will make it easier for the program committee to get to work planning future engagements.

3. **Offices and Positions of the Guild** - Thank you to those of you who indicated you would accept a position on the executive board or one of the committees. The Guild is completely composed of volunteers. Although these are all unpaid positions, there are many rewards for serving in these positions including that of being in the company of some spectacular ladies.

The Nominating Committee is already in the process of candidate selection for the various positions. Please be willing to step up to the plate when asked to serve your guild in one of the very important offices.

4. **Philanthropic Activities** – You are a generous and giving group. Activities you'd like to participate in include a workshop/day of sewing for nursing homes (16), "Make-a-Blanket Day" with groups like Project Linus and Home of the Brave (20), a monthly collection of items for charities such as Hope House and SPCA (12) and lastly, one member suggested making pillow cases. You're a very capable group, too, as no one asked for help with their quilt for Camp WWD.

5. **Guild Activities** – You really do want more activities and events. Let's do a season-long Mystery Quilt project (14), shorter duration projects (16), a retreat (12), more quilt show bus trips like those to the Paducah and Columbus shows (20), Guild quilt challenge (10), charm square fabric swap, and a round robin (1).

6. **Business Segment** –The balance between business and the program is satisfactory for most of you (32); more details about item reports for one member was requested. It's a tie - five members want more business items handled at the regular monthly meetings, and five members think the business items should be left to the board to handle at board meetings. Longer quilt programs are a good idea to two members.

7. **Show & Tell** – Appleseed Quilters Guild is fortunate to have a spectacular quilt show every month with Show & Tell. You have indicated overwhelmingly that you really enjoy Show & Tell and you like to see it after the program. Holding it before the program is attractive to five people.

8. **Long Range Planning** – Your suggestions include:  
Continue with new member write-ups in the newsletter.  
Pursue school programs to teach the youth how to sew and quilt (e.g.: the Northside school project).  
Reprise the Chinese auction, the Guild Christmas and Holiday Party and bring in more speakers and more trunk shows!

Your comments and opinions are important to planning events, speakers, and classes for the coming years. Your desires have been shared with the appropriate committees. The Board appreciates your input and we look forward to serving you in the coming year. Thanks again for taking the time to help us help you.

## **PROGRAM NOTES**

The quilt show is just a few months away, so our April meeting is going to cover tips for entering your quilt into the show. We hope this will encourage all of you to enter a quilt into the show whether you have it judged or not.

The subjects will be as follows:

- How to measure and attach a border
- How to bind the quilt
- How to make and attach a sleeve to your quilt for hanging
- Tips on what the judges look for when judging
- How to make a portable design wall

We have canceled **Leigh McDonald's** May classes due to lack of interest. We are going to do something a little different in May instead. We are going to have one to two hour mini workshops revolving around little art projects.

**Debi Potts** gave us some interesting little cards a few months back for the monthly mini, and some members were interested in learning how to make them. I thought maybe some of you would like to experiment with the fabric cards I make, or even make a little bigger project with fabric and fusing, so that is the second workshop. The-third workshop will be announced at the meeting.

Listen to this: the classes will be free! Some of the supplies will be provided to you by the instructor for a small fee, and there may be a few supplies that you'll need to purchase before the class. We will have sign-up sheets as we would normally would for any class so you can prepare ahead of time.

We also thought we would have Terry prepare a lunch that day which you can pay for at the April meeting. The cost for lunch will be \$8.50. We ask that you honor the restriction of no food being brought into Classic Cafe.

Our evening lecture for May will be **Elisa Sims Albury**, who is the editor of *Quilter's World* from DRG Publications. She will give us a talk on her journey as a quilter and some information about DRG publishing.

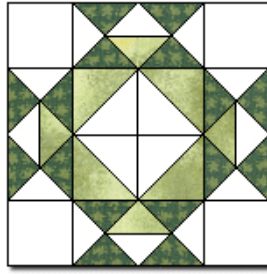

## **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**



**Lesson #10 Using a Split-Complimentary Color Scheme**

This plan combines the analogous and the complimentary color schemes to create some very beautiful color effects. The appeal of this plan is the natural temperature change which enhances the design.

In a split-complimentary plan, the complement (the temperature shifting color) always lies opposite the middle of the analogous colors. The analogous color band is usually comprised of three of five colors. If you are working with cool analogous hues the complement will be warm. If you are using warm analogous colors, the complementary color will be cool.

Select one color family to play a dominant role and another to take a secondary position. The remaining colors should be used as accents. This month's block is "Crown of Thorns 2" and we will be using **blue as the split-complimentary color** and **orange-yellow as the complimentary color**. Have fun creating a really awesome block. ## **KIDS' QUILTS**

We have the expectation that each member of Appleseed will make a quilt for a child attending Camp Watcha-Wanna-Do. It is completely on the honor system. And honor it you do. Thank you. We so appreciate the time you take to lovingly make this quilt.

We always worry just a little bit at this time of year when we see that we need 80 more quilts. But, we worry just because it is in our nature to do so. We know that you will come through for us, and most of all for the campers who look forward to choosing their favorite quilt when they arrive at camp.

I listened as a mother told the story about her daughter who goes to camp and brings the quilts she has received in past years to make a cozy nest in her room. Each quilt tells a little bit of the story of her cancer by reminding her of what stage of treatment she was in at that time, and thankfully of the recovery she was in when she picked out that next special quilt. So far she is eight years cancer free. She loves her quilts.

The children might choose their quilt just by the feel of some soft and warm fabric. Treatments that the children have received can have a side effect of feeling very cold so a soft side such as flannel or fleece is very popular to cuddle up to. If you back your quilt with fleece it may not even need a batting layer so it'll be done in two shakes instead of three!

Have you made a strippy quilt? It's as easy as pie and so quick. Add a wild and crazy gecko or monster truck applique and you've got a winner. Don't forget to sew on the Appleseed label. They are available at each meeting at the membership table.

We have collected 43 Kids' Quilts. Only 80 more to go! Are you bringing yours in April? We'll have lots of time during show and tell where you can show your wild creations. Go on, get busy!

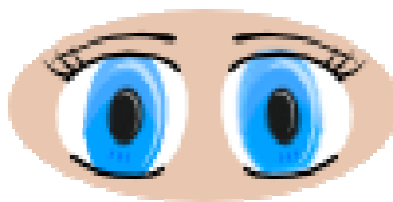

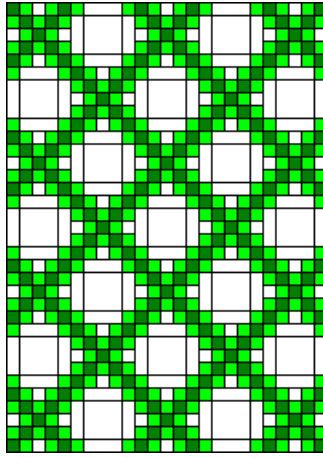
