FROM THE PRESIDENT

Greetings, Appleseed Quilters!

As 2025 draws to a close, I am already looking ahead with excitement to what 2026 has in store for our guild. We have some big plans on the horizon, important business to attend to, and—of course—plenty of QUILT-related inspiration to enjoy!

First, I would like to share a preview of our 2026 programs. The Programs Committee has been hard at work and has assembled an impressive lineup that includes national speakers, engaging workshops, and inspiring trunk shows. Be sure to attend our January meeting to hear all the details.

Thanks to the success of our recent Quilt Show, the Board of Directors has approved a \$2,000 increase to the Programs budget to help support these exciting opportunities in 2026. This proposed budget adjustment will be presented to you, the general membership, for approval at the January meeting.

Because our Quilt Show is held every other year, we also have time in the “off year” to explore additional fundraising opportunities. One idea that has been suggested is a Quilters Bingo event. As a first-time event in 2026, this would be planned as a smaller-scale gathering to work out the details and assess its viability. An outline for how the event could work is already in place, but we will need a team of approximately five volunteers willing to organize and move this project forward. If this is something you would enjoy being involved in, please contact me or any member of the Board.

We are also exploring additional Bee opportunities where members can gather to sew and socialize together. If you have ideas for a centrally located space that could host a Sunday, once-a-month Bee—or know of a suitable location in the southwest area—please let me know. Your suggestions are welcome as we work to expand these opportunities.

As we begin the new guild year, there are also several ways you may wish to contribute. We are currently seeking a Board of Directors Chair for the position now titled Quilt Show Chairperson. This role does not require overseeing the next quilt show; rather, it involves serving as a liaison and reporting quilt show matters to the Board of Directors.

If you feel called to help guide and support the management of Appleseed Quilters Guild, this is a meaningful and rewarding way to serve. Please reach out to me personally by phone, email, or in person at the January guild meeting if you are interested or would like more information. The Board meets monthly on Tuesday evenings, one week following our guild meeting.

As we welcome the New Year, I wish each of you a happy, healthy, and creative 2026. May it be filled with beautiful fabrics, inspired stitching, and the joy of sharing our love of quilting together.



 - Fabric can be any size, with size indicated, or panels, bundles, precuts, etc.
 - Anything donated that does not sell can be picked up at 9:00pm or they will be repurposed for fundraising or donated to the Dove's Nest Thrift Store

You can also sell your items! You can rent a table at the garage sale for \$10. You keep all the proceeds of the items you sell. You also leave with any items that are not sold.


MEMBERSHIP




Indiana Heritage Quilt Show

Churro Snack Mix

(from Sarah Krafty)

2 sticks butter	1 c. packed brown sugar
1 tsp. vanilla	1 tsp. cinnamon
1 pkg. oyster crackers	

Topping:

¾ c. sugar	½ tsp. cinnamon
¼-½ tsp salt	

Staci Overbeck wanted to share her Churro snack mix recipe she brought to the Holiday party. Many people asked ... So here you go!

Melt butter in skillet, add brown sugar, vanilla, and cinnamon. Cook over med/high heat until bubbly. Add crackers and stir to coat. Line baking sheet (with sides) with aluminum foil. Pour cracker mixture into pan and spread evenly. Bake at 350 for 10-15 minutes. (I would stir part way through.) In a small bowl, mix topping. Remove crackers from oven. While they are still warm, sprinkle with sugar mixture and toss to coat. Store in air tight container.

GENERAL GUILD INFORMATION

- Appleseed Quilters Guild Meetings are held at the Mizpah Shrine Center, 1015 Memorial Way, Fort Wayne, IN, 46805 on the first Tuesday of every month, except holidays. Technique demonstrations start at 6pm. Social time starts at 6:30pm. Meetings start promptly at 7:00pm. There is usually a speaker or presentation. The meetings conclude with Show and Tell.
- The regular monthly guild meetings are free to non-members, with a limit of three free visits. A fee may be charged to non-members attending special meetings featuring a nationally acclaimed speaker.
- Our membership year is October 1st through September 31st. Dues are \$35 per year, due October 1st. There is a midyear dues discount, starting April 1st. Checks for dues can be paid at any meeting or mailed to the PO Box.
- A variety of the Appleseed Quilt Guild workshops and retreats are available to non-members. There are fees for these extra events for members and non-members.
- Appleseed Quilters Guild offers education, inspiration, and community. The Quilt Bees, block of the month, challenges, and philanthropic projects are very popular. Appleseed Quilters Guild also hosts the biennial Fort Wayne Quilt Fest.
- Located in Fort Wayne, IN, Appleseed Quilters Guild began in 1993 as a small, quilting group, and has grown to 150+ members. Appleseed Quilters Guild includes all ages. In 1996, Appleseed Quilters Guild was recognized as a 501(c) (3) organization.
- Appleseed Quilters Guild strives to create an interest in the making, collecting, and preserving of quilts. Appleseed Quilters Guild also seeks to establish and promote educational and philanthropic endeavors through quilting.
- Meetings will be canceled if severe weather dictates. Cancellations will be posted on our Facebook page. Follow our Facebook page for the latest information on all our events.
