

Let's fill the basket and celebrate the New Year- Appleseed Quilters Guild style!





Fortune Cookie Instructions

- 1. Trace the circle on the next page onto a piece of fusible web. Cut out on the line.
- 2. Place two 6" squares of fabric right sides together.
- 3. Fuse web circle onto back of one square. Do not remove paper at the time.
- 4. Shorten your stitch length on your machine so that the stitches will be quite close together.
- 5. With matching thread, stitch around the outside of the fusible web, close to the web. Leave
- a 1 1/2' opening, making sure to back stitch at the beginning and ending.
- 6. Trim away the selvage close to the stitching line, approximately 1/8-1/4".
- 7. Take paper off but DO NOT PRESS.
- 8. Turn inside out, lifting fusible as needed to smooth. Be careful not to stretch it out of shape, especially the opening.
- 9. Turn the selvage inside along the opening, making sure the curve looks smooth. DO NOT PRESS.
- 10. Machine topstitch around the edge of the "cookie" 1/8" from edge, making sure to catch opening selvages inside. PRESS.
- 11. Fold in half and press firmly to create a crease down the center. Open up and fold in half the other way also. It should be folded into 4 sections. (The inside fabric will become the outside of the "cookie").
- 12. Stitch down the center of the crease leaving ½" on each end unstitched. Be sure to backstitch. (See illustration on next page).
- 13. Fold and place "fortune" paper on the side of the cookie along the stitched seam. (See illustration).
- 14. Flip each curved edge inside out, to form a clamshell shape. Adjust as necessary to make it look like a fortune cookie.
